Maya Gallery Wien, under the direction of Maryam Mansouri, began its activities in 2022 in Vienna — the capital of Austria and the heart of European art.


Maya Gallery serves as a platform for showcasing the works of artists from around the world.

In collaboration with independent artists, galleries, auction houses, interior designers, architects, and corporations, we curate an exceptional collection of artwork that transcends boundaries.



Afshan Khan (India)





Artist: Afshan Khan Title: Eternal Love Medium: Gouache / Watercolours Dimensions: 60 × 60 CM Year: 2024

Description

Inspired by the iconic film Titanic, Eternal Love captures a poignant cinematic moment—one of love, sacrifice, and separation. Rendered in deep blues to reflect the ocean's melancholy, it immerses the viewer in both visual and emotional depth. This piece evokes not just a scene, but a feeling—where two souls are eternally bound. She lived for him; he died for her. A timeless tribute to selfless love that continues to resonate.

Alexandra Zeilinger (Austria)





Artist: Alexandra Zeilinger Title: Timetravel Medium: 3D Collage / Mixed Media Dimensions: 70 x 50 CM Year: 2024

Description

Timetravel addresses the outdated image of women prevalent in the early 20th century—portraying societal expectations of women as sweet, neat, loving housewives, and obedient caretakers. Today, with such views resurfacing in various places, this artwork stands as a bold call for women to embrace confidence and independence. Part of a six-piece series, the image was cut and layered to create a three-dimensional effect. A dark background draws the eye toward the central motif, intensifying its message and presence.

Ana Momeni (Austria)





Artist: Ana Momeni Title: Airless Bubble (Luftlose Blase) Medium: Oil on Canvas Dimensions: 100 x 80 CM Year: 2019

Description

"Airless Bubble" is a visual narrative of suffocating silence and the inner loneliness of the modern human. A weary face wrapped in a transparent plastic layer becomes a symbol of deceptive protection — one that brings not comfort, but suffocation.

The artwork serves as a metaphor for those who appear calm and intact on the outside, yet are internally overwhelmed by psychological pressure, environmental crises, and societal expectations. Through a blend of cold tones, dark shadows, and meticulous detail, the piece creates a space that not only captures the viewer's eye, but also conveys a haunting sense of silence and breathlessness.

Description:

Rooted in a personal experience, this artwork carries a deep affection for a beloved cat who has passed. Upon returning home, the cat would greet with a fleeting stretch and a calm, composed expression—a brief, almost uncatchable moment. Unable to capture it in a photo, the memory lingers with a sense of wonder: were the colorful shapes around it reflections of the cat's fleeting, intricate mind? P.S. This work was selected for the "50 Artists to Discover – 2025 Edition" catalogue by Florence Contemporary Gallery, Italy, as the most representative piece of my artistic practice.







"Bol"—an Urdu word meaning "Speak"—is a call to raise one's voice against injustice. The artwork urges us to speak up boldly, because every voice can make a difference. I used the three traffic signal colors as symbols, reflecting how societal systems operate. Resistance is a visual reminder of the power of expression and moral courage.

Description

An Iranian woman holds hope deep within her heart. From the fractures and struggles of life, she grows and blooms—grounded in her identity, nurtured by her roots. This piece reflects resilience, cultural pride, and the quiet power of transformation.

Description

This piece was inspired by a moment when another woman, across the sea, reached out with something handmade—woven with care, blessings, and love. It reminded the artist of the quiet, powerful ways women support one another through unspoken threads of connection, even across great distances. The work reflects the cycles women move through—birth, change, silence, and growth—and how, in still moments, it is often a gesture from another woman that reminds us we are not alone. This piece stands as a tribute to that invisible sisterhood, to the strength passed from hand to hand, heart to heart.

Nona Papashvili (Georgia)







Description

A piece of contemporary art that combines traditional embroidery with modern design, this work stands out for its use of dimensional embroidery techniques. Each flower is crafted from multiple layers, giving the composition both depth and a realistic effect.

The choice of motifs—rose and lilac—carries symbolic meaning. The rose, a symbol of love and beauty, and the lilac, often associated with purity and spirituality, form a harmonious combination that reflects the beauty of nature and the inner world of the human spirit.

In this piece, the artist explores the harmony between land and sea, using deep blues and navy to evoke the mysterious pull of the ocean and the quiet majesty of mountains. Touches of burnt amber and ochre introduce warmth and contrast, allowing the landscape to breathe with subtle earthy tones. The use of textured layers is a deliberate choice, giving the painting a sense of movement and depth—as if one could feel the waves or trace the rugged edges of the peaks. Through this work, the artist expresses a sense of stillness within strength, offering a reminder of how nature grounds and inspires us.




